Tobias Aguirre will be moderating the opening plenary, "[Sustainable Seafood: How Does it](#)

[Stack Up?](#)" presented at the beginning of the Summit for all attendees.

Jen Cole will be moderating the plenary session "[Building Socially Responsible Seafood Supply Chains through Worker Voice](#)" which will include an engaging introductory panel and ensuing discussion led by industry and NGO representatives using worker voice to improve seafood supply chains.

Sara Lewis will be participating in "[The Business Case of Traceability](#)" with World Wildlife Fund, Future of Fish, and IFT's Global Food Traceability Center. Following brief presentations from the panel, the session will divide into focus groups for facilitated discussions regarding traceability tools, implementation, and the role of industry.

Call for Further Tuna Sustainability Efforts



FishWise is pleased to share the release of the Global Sustainability Outreach Appeal, a call for action by tuna RFMOs to address long-term sustainability of tuna fisheries. The effort has been coordinated by the NGO Tuna Forum, a group of organizations that work

comprehensively on tuna sustainability issues globally, and has been shared with RFMOs in advance of their 2018 general meetings. Currently 118 commercial and non-profit organizations have signed onto the appeal including five of our partners (i.e. Albertsons Co., Hy-Vee, North Atlantic Seafood, Santa Monica Seafood, and Sea Delight). We commend this effort and thank them for making tuna sustainability a priority.
